That really helped with the increased transportation costs with the judges. Other Regions have not been as fortunate as us with respect to attendance at their shows. I would like to thank everyone that attended and supported the show either by showing and/or volunteering to help.

Our next show coming up is the KILE Show in Harrisburg, PA on Sunday, October 5, 2008. Since the Northeast Gaited Show is not happening this year please come out and support this show. There is danger that we may lose this show next year if we do not get more then 45 horses to attend. The show has two judges for double points, the premiums are cheap and the prize money is good! You are allowed to bring horses in on Saturday afternoon and show management the past couple of years have had us stalled close to the ring all in one area.

Mark your calendars off for the Annual Meeting and Banquet on Saturday, November 1, 2008. Location and cost is still pending, more details to follow via email or next issue.

The National Office is always on us about the declining membership and we get reports for expiring and new members just about every month. I am happy to report that even though we lost members with the addition of the Virginia Region between 2006 and 2007, we are one of three regions that had positive growth between 2007 and 2008 all the other Regions had declining numbers. We need to keep up the positive trend!

DEADLINE REMINDER September 16, 2008 is the deadline to submit all of your forms to Sandy Thomas for Please High Point Awards. They include all non-show activities that were completed with your Paso for this past year. Events include demonstrations, parades, scheduled trail rides, etc. Refer to the Award Program Information Sheet in this issue for the complete list of qualifying activities. There are no exceptions to the deadline since entries have to be tabulated and awards ordered for presentation at the annual meeting. No information is required to be submitted for the Show High Point Awards.

Beginning September 1, 2008, rule proposal changes can begin to be submitted to PFHA for the 2011 vote. If you are thinking of any rule changes you can speak with our Delegate, BJ Schuler or bring them to the Annual Meeting in November.

My experience in Colombia:

In the United States, Americans view Colombia as a dangerous place to go. It is not a common place to visit for your typical American. I am not your typical person and I was thrill when I received an email telling me I had made Team USA!

Nothing could have ever prepared me for my experiences in Colombia! My memories of my time there and the friends I have made will be in my heart forever.

Going to Colombia I had set up for a horse to ride. About a month or two before leaving it fell through. I had set up with several other horses, all of them falling through as well. When I arrived in Colombia, my mom and I, along with some friends went to look for horses. I kept coming up empty handed. After 3 days of finding nothing I decided to pray really hard and go with the horse bank.

On the day of the horse bank (Monday July, 14)

one of our coaches, Carlos Tobon came with this list of horses. He was reading off the names and almost every team member had a Paso Fino, except Kelly Rucker (who got a Trocha Pura) and me with a Trote Galope. I was a little apprehensive considering the first time I had ever ridden a Trote Galope was on Saturday (July 12)! When I arrived to my first practice the groom, Mario, came over with a beautiful bay gelding named Prestigio de la Gabriela. His face was so sweet and he looks so much like my mare from home. Then the owner came over who is a boy named Andreas. He was one of the first people I had met when I arrived to Colombia! I knew this was the horse God picked for me.

Thanks to the help of my friend, Zarela Olson, Diana Venagas, & Lysandra Venagas-Singer. They arranged for me to practice riding a Trote Galope everyday at their friends farm (La Vitrina). The Trainer Gabriel Martinez & Julio were so wonderful and helpful to me. I would not have been able to do what I had done without their help. With all the practice my competition went wonderful! The horses I had practiced on, you had to make them work. Prestigio is a perfect horse. If I've ever had a perfect ride, that was it! I knew that we had competed to the best of our ability. I think my smile was almost coming off my face when they called me for the top three! The only problem was the microphone was breaking so I had no idea what placement I had received! Carlos stopped me and put the flag on me, telling me to take a victory lap, but I still have NO idea what place I had! I was so excited and happy though! I found out that I had won First place (which is the silver medal)

It was better then a dream come true. I must say that I had imagined it a little differently. I never would have guess I'd be riding a Trote Galope! (Which I have now fallen in love with.) Standing there on the podium with friends from different countries and surrounded by my fellow team members was surreal.

I was teased that I was the American Ambassador. Because I am so shy *HAHA!* and had a wonderful time making new friendships with the team members from all the other countries. They are friendships that will last a life time! Plus now I can go ride horses with friends in a bunch of different countries!

Thanks to all of those who helped make these moments possible! Especially to the Team USA coaches, Christy Meyer, Carlos Tobon, & Diego Bravo. Also to our sponsors, my parents, family & friends, and God. Without them none of this would have been possible! You all helped my dream to become a reality. Thank you!

It was a once in a lifetime opportunity to be there representing my country, to make new friendships, and to cheer on my team mates. Michelle Gomez placed Bronze. Daniel Londono placed forth. Both Isis Beltran and Christine Meyer made the cut, and all the other riders rode amazingly. It was an honer to represent my country in this way.

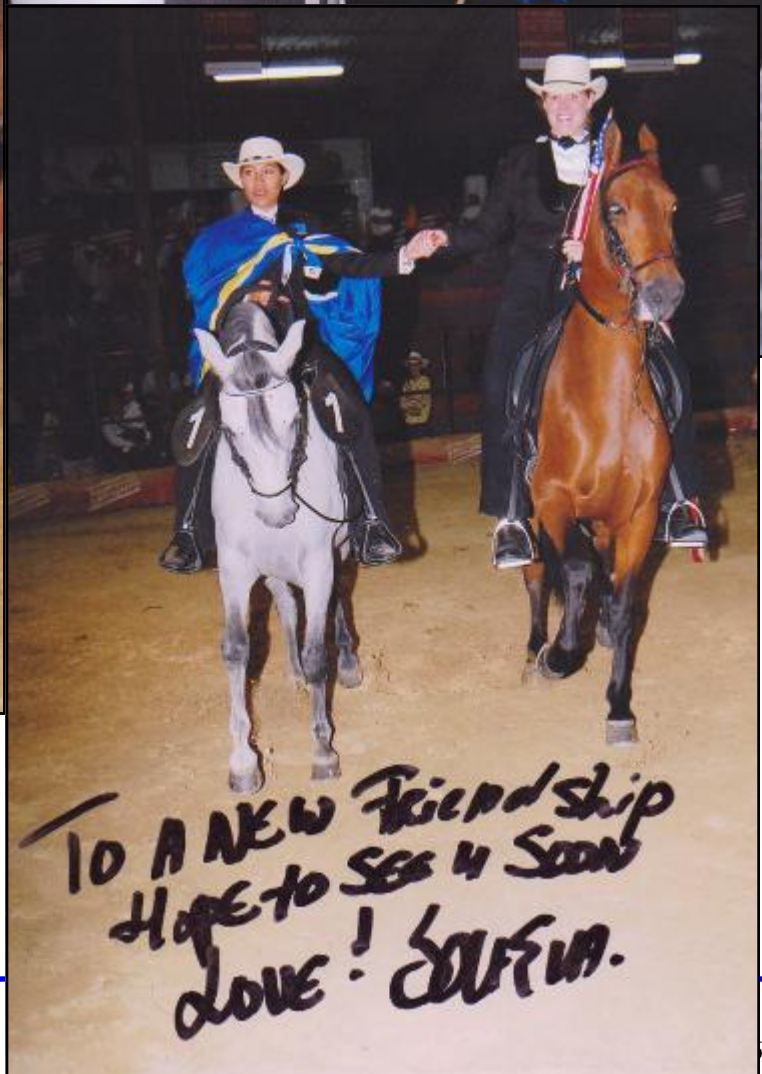

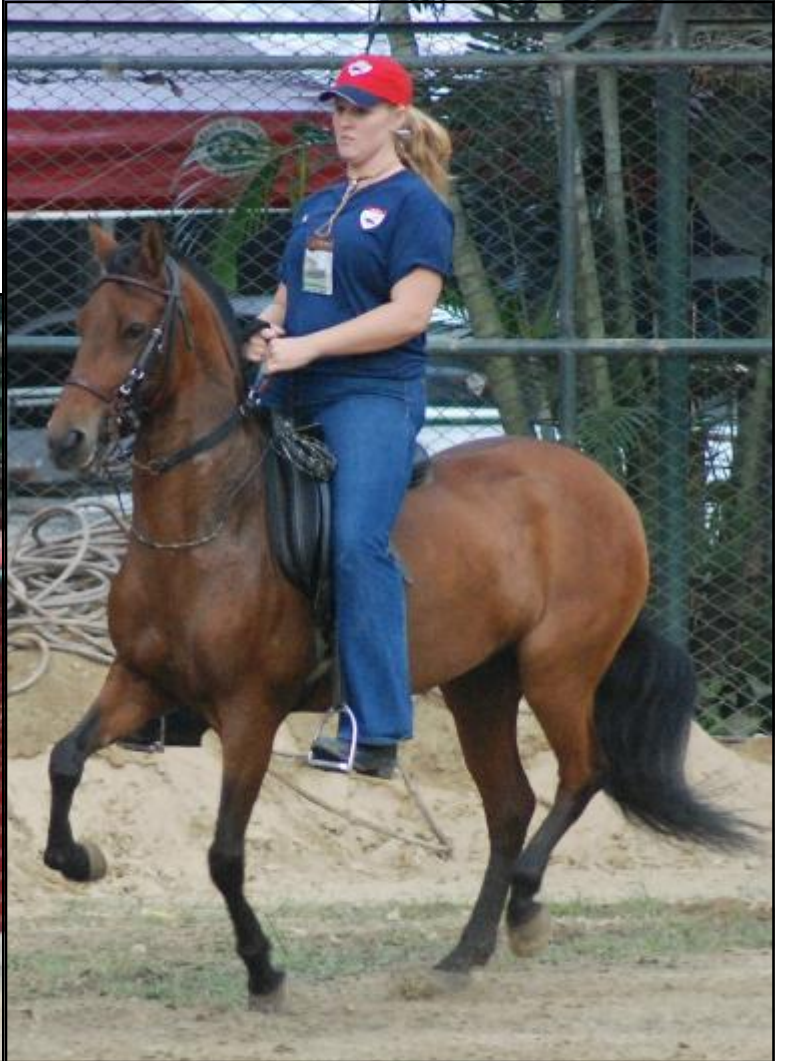

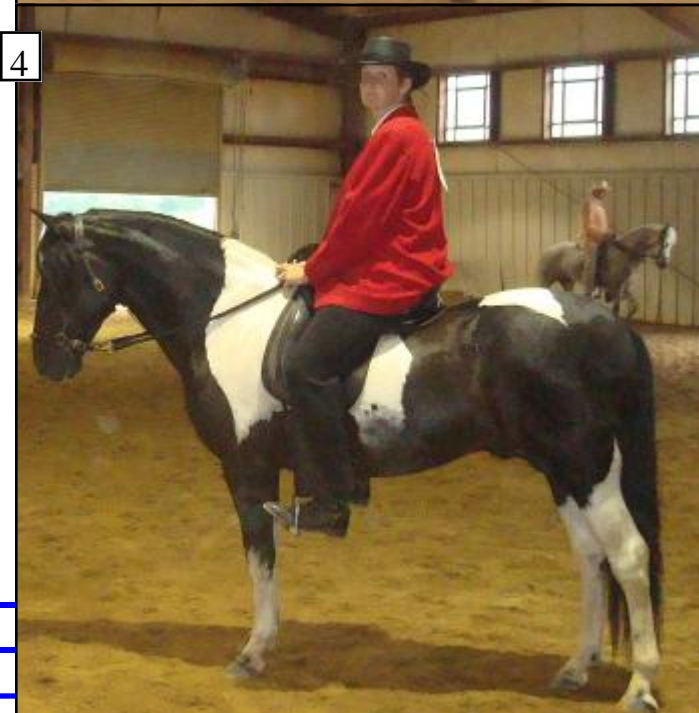

Many techniques were discussed and practiced throughout the day. Jim shared his extensive knowledge of techniques to improve gait, communication, proper tack fitting, coordination and balance. He mixed it all together with a heaping lump of good horse sense. Lunchtime was a special treat with BJ manning the grill. An extra bonus was a visit to BJ's new Swissy puppies!

Riding Clinic held Independence Day Weekend at Hillside Farms

Who can deny the splendor of watching a Paso Fino gaiting gracefully, evenly and consistently? Moving out in the show ring or on the trail – it looks so.... effortless. Is it?

How do riders *help* their horses to gait? **Jim Laird** of the **Paji Learning Center** conducted a clinic on July 5th focused on this topic. Here are just a few of many helpful exercises demonstrated and practiced:

1. We learned how to safely and properly stretch, flex and bend our horses. You know how when you get out of bed some mornings feeling stiff and achy? You know that when you feel that way you are not physically ready to perform any demanding athletic activity. Stretching is the precursor for any human athletic event. Our horses also perform better when they stretch, flex and bend before the demanding activity of the show ring and trail. Stretching should never be forced. Stretching, flexing and bending should be done consistently before you ride your Paso Fino to allow them freedom of movement to perform those gaits we so enjoy.

2. We rode our Paso Fino horses at a walk focusing on removing barriers to a balanced way of going. Remember that walking is a four beat gait (too)! We checked seat, legs, and hands for symmetry on the straight way. We practiced various ways to aid our horses in a turn, allowing the horse to bend while continuing at an even four beat gait. At a walk, we practiced circles in both directions. Jim commented that a round pen is helpful for these exercises but drawing a circle on the ground or going around a tree works fine. Jim suggested that if the horse initially has trouble flexing in a turn, try riding a bigger circle.

We applied these same principles at the corto and largo. One of the cool things about going to a clinic is that other riders and the clinician can offer helpful visual feedback. When not inadvertently fighting the horse with poor balance or technique we reduced the amount of effort it takes for the horses to gait evenly and consistently.

Clinics such as this one help us to bring out the best in our Paso Fino horses. I saw horses gaiting naturally and gracefully... always a beautiful sight to see! And as a rider, in those moments of harmony when we gaited the feeling was... exhilarating!

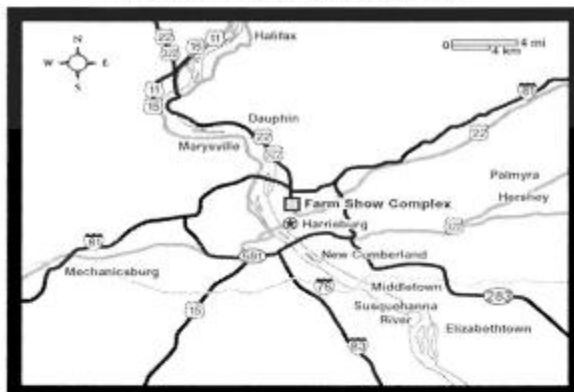

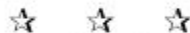

Bring a current Negative Coggins for each horse and be prepared to show when asked.

Bedding is STRAW ONLY (bring your own) and all stalls used must be bedded (except tack stalls). Bring your own horse care supplies including grain, buckets, hay, cleaning tools etc. **All stalls must be stripped clean before leaving** --- designated manure piles are located near the barns.

A limited number of TACK STALLS are available at \$15 per night per stall and must be pre-reserved with Jacquie by calling 410-923-6157 by Wed. Oct. 10. Tack stalls may be shared.
