Rick Shaffer Participated in the Trainers Challenge held March 24-25, 2012 at the Lone Hickory Arena, Yadkinville, NC. Here's his report!

All: I'll give an overview of the Trainers Challenge. I was asked by Milda Minter if I wanted to participate in an event called The Trainers Challenge. I asked what it was and she said its like The Road to the Horse. Road to the horse was started a few years ago and is when Three trainers get to work with an unbroken horse in a round pen by yourself. One Trainer—One horse, you have an allotted time each session. Then at the end, whatever trainer can do the most with his horse is the winner. Milda decided to put on an event similar to Road To The horse but called it The Trainers Challenge and here's how it worked. Myself, Clay Cox and Helen Frost were picked as the three trainers, the event was held in Yadkinville North Carolina. It was on March 24th and 25th of 2012. The horses we used were three Paso Fino Geldings that were raised by Charlie and Milda and were only halter broke. Milda brought the horses and put one horse in one round pen an then the other and the other in the last pen. We the trainers had 1-1/2 hours to work with the horses and we had to take a ten minute break sometime with in the 1-1/2 time frame. We did four sessions in all; Two on Saturday and two on Sunday. We were judged by three judges in each session. It wasn't judged on who rode there horse first, but what you did to get your horse under saddle. The last session you had a list of things you were going to be judged on and 7 obstacles. You didn't have to ride your horse but were scored higher if you had your horse under saddle. The list of things we had to do were - pick up all four hooves and clean them, saddle and bridle your horse, stand to be mounted, then we had to walk in both directions, and gait in both directions and then canter in both directions and then we went out of the round pen and did the obstacles. After that the judges added up the results and a winner was announced. I was able to come out on top and win the event. It was the first time I had ever done something like this and it was a great experience. I had a lot of fun and Milda is going to try to make it a yearly event. Also between the sessions Milda had clinicians work with you an your horse so you could bring your own horse and be in the clinic. It was a great weekend and I encourage anyone who can attend next year to come and see for yourself!

Mason-Dixon PFHA Election 2012

Yes, painful as it is, the election season is upon us. As we tune out (or tune into) the attack ads and rhetoric on the National Stage and engage or flee from the State and Local contests, there is ONE riveting, engaging, POLITE, and influential election worth tracking. That election is the contest for who will lead the Mason-Dixon PFHA for 2013 and 2014.

During the MDPFHA Annual Meeting on 3 November 2012, we will elect a new panel of Officers to guide our organization, but the process will begin long before November. This is the 1st installment of election information. Let's begin with identifying the positions in which Officers serve, the requirements and the roles they play in the organization. This information is drawn directly from the Mason-Dixon by-laws.

President: The President shall be the Chief Executive Officer of Mason Dixon and shall preside over all meetings thereof and meetings of the Board of Directors. The President shall have the right to appoint a Parliamentarian and all Mason Dixon Committee Chairpersons as may be deemed requisite and perform such other and further acts and functions as are usually performed by a President of a Membership Association.

Vice President: The Vice-President shall in the absence or during the incapacity of the President perform the duties and functions of the President's office.

Secretary: The Secretary shall record and maintain a record of the minutes of all meetings and proceedings of Mason Dixon PFHA, conduct correspondence and perform such other secretarial duties as may be required by the President, the Board of Directors and the incorporation records maintenance.

Treasurer: The Treasurer shall be the fiscal officer of Mason Dixon and shall deposit all funds received in the designated banking institution in the name of Mason Dixon PFHA. The Treasurer shall maintain an accurate account of all finances and financial transactions and shall make all authorized disbursements.

The Treasurer shall ensure that disbursements are made only through the official Mason Dixon checking account. Itemized vouchers shall support disbursements and the Treasurer shall maintain vouchers. An annual audit of the files and accounts of the Association may be conducted by a qualified person appointed by the President at the close of each fiscal year and the results of such audit shall be reported to the members at the next occurring annual meeting. Interim audits may also be made upon giving at least ten (10) days notice to the Treasurer. At the annual meeting a full and complete report of all receipts and disbursements and financial status of the Mason Dixon PFHA shall be made by the Treasurer. During the fiscal year interim financial reports may be requested by the President or the Board of Directors. No funds shall be withdrawn from the Association depository except by check signed by either the President, Vice President, or Treasurer, all of whom may be bonded in the amount determined by the Board of Directors. The Treasurer is responsible for all tax reports and returns as may be required by the State and Federal Governments.

Delegate: The Regional Representative to the PFHA shall represent the interests of the membership of the Mason Dixon PFHA at the PFHA by serving as a board member of that organization. In as much as is possible, the Regional Representative shall determine the wishes of the Mason Dixon membership on issues before the board of the PFHA and vote accordingly and at least make a full and complete report of all votes cast, including the rationale to the membership via the newsletter.

Past President: Note that the President from the previous election serves as a Board Member for 2 years following their term.

Now that you know what the Officers are obligated to do as individuals, there is more to it. The Officers function as a group. The duties and responsibilities of the Board are as follows, as defined in the By-laws:

Duties and Responsibilities: The Board of Directors shall be the administrative and policy making body of Mason Dixon PFHA and have general supervision of the affairs thereof. No act of the Board of Directors, however, shall conflict with the By Laws of the Mason Dixon PFHA.

- The Board shall hold at least two (2) meetings per year at such times and places designated by the President.
- The Board shall have the right to declare a vacancy in its membership when any member without just cause fails to attend (2) consecutive Board meetings.
- The Board shall have the right to fill any vacancy on said Board by electing a new member who shall hold such office until the next election of officers.
- The presence in person of a majority of the Board members shall be requisite for the transaction of business at any meeting thereof and a majority vote of such members present shall be necessary for a decision.
- The Board of Directors may censure, suspend, or expel from Mason Dixon PFHA any member charged with acts of conduct detrimental to the Association and/or in violation of the Code of Ethics detailed in the PFHA Constitution. Disciplinary action will be imposed after a due and proper hearing at which the accused is afforded an opportunity to be heard and defended on all charges.

According to the By-laws, Members have responsibilities too:

Membership Responsibilities: To be entitled to full Mason Dixon PFHA benefits one must:

- Be a member of Mason Dixon PFHA
- Maintain current Mason Dixon PFHA dues.
- Maintain good standing with Mason Dixon PFHA and
- Not have designated a region other than Mason Dixon as one's regional affiliation.

Members with a regional affiliation other than Mason Dixon PFHA with PFHA are entitled to all benefits with the exception of voting on national matters, voting in Mason Dixon PFHA elections and holding office in Mason Dixon PFHA.

The first step in the Election Process is for the President to select a NOMINATING COMMITTEE. The By-laws state:

The President, within a reasonable time after the annual meeting, shall appoint a nominating committee consisting of three (3) Mason Dixon voting members in good standing, none of whom are officers of the Association. The responsibility of this committee will be to actively solicit and encourage qualified candidates and make as well as receive nominations for offices for the ensuing term. The nominating committee must ascertain that each person nominated is willing and able to perform the duties of the office and must receive written or verbal consent from the candidate. The committee

shall publish to the membership the list of candidates for each office thirty (30) days prior to the election and the Annual Meeting. Nominations for any office may be made by any member in good standing from the floor at the annual meeting. All nominees must give prior consent to have their name placed in nomination, including nominations from the floor. A nominating committee member will voluntarily resign from the Nominating Committee if he or she is nominated for an office of the Association. The Nominating Committee shall remain in force until its recommendations are presented to the Presiding Officer at the Annual Membership Meeting.

"Who can run for Office?", you might ask. The By-laws define eligibility as:

Eligibility for Office: No person shall be eligible to serve as an officer of Mason Dixon PFHA unless such person has been an active member in good standing with Mason Dixon PFHA for at least twelve (12) months prior to the date of nomination. No person shall hold more than one (1) elective office in the Mason Dixon PFHA at one time.

During the Election, we will be voting on proposed changes to the By-Laws. Proposed changes (Amendments) shall be submitted to the Editor of the Newsletter and the Secretary. Amendments to the By-Laws may be adopted by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of the members present at any regular or special meeting of Mason Dixon PFHA at which there is at least 20 members present, provided also that written notice of such meeting and any proposed amendment shall have been given at least two (2) weeks prior to such meeting to the membership.

Stuffing the Ballot Box will be accomplished in two ways: Ballots will be completed either during the Annual Meeting or submitted via mailed Absentee Ballot. The details are outlined in the By-laws as follows: Election Procedures: Members who are unable to attend the annual meeting may vote by absentee ballot. An absentee ballot may be used only for the election of officers. The form for the Absentee Ballot will be published in the Association's newsletter. All absentee ballots shall be completed according to requirements stated on the ballot and shall be sent to the Secretary of the Association to be received no later that 5 days before the annual meeting. Any member voting by absentee ballot shall have been a member in good standing of the Mason Dixon PFHA for thirty (30) days prior to the meeting. If you intend to vote at the Meeting, you must also renew your membership at that time!

Remember that Memberships in Mason-Dixon PFHA expire on 30 September 2012. If you intend to vote by Absentee Ballot, you MUST have your membership renewal submitted to Kathy Dell NO LATER THAN 3 October 2012 to remain eligible to vote. Remember: Your PFHA affiliation MUST be aligned with the Mason-Dixon Region for you to participate in this election.

Up to this point we understand that ours is an organization of paying members who participate in various ways. All service to the organization is voluntary. Candidate Officers volunteer to fill the roles described above. Beside the elected positions, there are essential positions, identified and appointed by the MDPFHA President. Our current appointed positions are those of: Membership Chair and Youth Chair. Members volunteer to serve as organizers for shows, demonstrations, trail rides and other organizational events. While many of us volunteer to help the organization function and improve, only the Board is chosen by the members. During this Election year, we will have an opportunity to select those who will guide our organization for 24 months. Given the challenging fiscal climate, it is critical that we make thoughtful choices when selecting our next Board of Directors.

Ask the Vett Strategic Worming

MDPFHA Members: Our Equine Vet., Dr. Penny Grove, DVM, recently published a newsletter to update her clients of subjects of importance to the care of their equine partners. Dr. Grove graciously allowed me to include an excerpt from her news letter in the current issue of the PowerGlide. This entry is not to be considered an advertisement or endorsement. It is provided to you for educational purposes only.—Diane Dutt

There is no perfect deworming program that fits all horses and all farms. Traditionally, a deworming program consisted of deworming horses every 8 weeks. Parasitologists are warning us that parasites have developed resistance to certain dewormers and eventually all dewormers could lose their effectiveness. Fecal exams help to determine which horses shed the highest numbers of eggs and therefore require the most intensive treatment. Some horses are naturally more resistant to parasites than others and may not need to be dewormed so frequently. Is your horse a low, moderate or heavy shedder of parasites? By doing a fecal exam at a specific time

interval after deworming, you could determine your horse's shedding status and potentially cut back significantly on the number of dewormings. This means less expense on buying dewormers for you and less stress for your horse. I don't know of any horse that enjoys the taste of dewormers or the act of squirting foreign substances into his mouth. With fewer dewormings, there is less chance of the parasites developing resistance. Once a "shedding" status is determined, an annual fecal exam is still recommended for purposes of routine surveillance, just as in cats and dogs. When a new horse arrives at your barn, could it be carrying parasites that are resistant to the dewormers that you are currently using? Horses are transported, mixed and sharepastures, allowing the transmission and widespread dispersal of resistant parasites. Over time, all of the horses at the same barn could be exposed to those same resistant parasites. All dewormers were highly effective when they were first introduced, but over time parasites have developed resistance to many of these drugs. Our goal is to optimize the use of the current dewormers in order to slow the development of drug resistant parasites. There are a number of free, online webinars and articles addressing strategic deworming and parasite resistance on www.thehorse.com.—Dr. Penny Grove



IT ALL STARTED WITH A BLACK MARE.....the story of Hillside Farms Paso Finos by BJ Schuler

It all started with a black mare named Ebonita. It was 1993 and Gary and I were traveling to the International Bison Conference in LaCrosse, Wisconsin in my father-in-law's big of motor home. We had stopped somewhere in Michigan for the night and were

reading the local paper at breakfast the next morning. There it was - an ad for a paso fino for sale. I knew that was the breed of horse I wanted to try because I read that it was a smooth ride. I also thought a paso fino would fit in well with the farm that we had started. We purchased my family's farm from my mother in 1990 and we already had a herd of buffalo, miniature donkeys, miniature horses and a Percheron. We called the number in the ad. It just so happened that the owner of the farm was on vacation that week and was home. We proceeded to drive to the farm and the owner put me on the sweetest black mare. She was well trained and smooth. I was very tempted to buy her on the spot but I didn't know anything about this breed of horse

and this farm was very far from home. What if I needed help with her? So, I passed up this opportunity. I just happened to have a PFHA Farm Directory with me from the research I had been doing on different breeds. So, on the way home from Wisconsin, we called Field-

stone Meadows to see if we could pay a visit. Jim Laird met us as we disembarked from the motor home and the rest is history. Over that next year, we bought 4 horses from Fieldstone Meadows (and Jim's old trailer) and bred 2 mares to their stallions. We went to the Harrisburg and Lexington shows to watch. We had our first foal in 1995. The year after that we were looking for our own stallion and travelled to California to visit Rancho Paso Bravo. We bought a stallion, a colt and a few mares from Charles Minter Sr. and started breeding our own stallion. We began showing, getting our feet wet at Harrisburg in the Bella Forma class with our first Juan Miguel del Prado filly.

had great fun showing everywhere. My most favorite show moment was at Lexington, VA in 2009 when my pleasure mare Atenea and I won first place with all our friends cheering us on. I didn't know at the time that would be her last show since unbeknownst to me she had an old injury that would cause her to go lame forever. She gave me her all that day.

Over the years, I've sold quite a few people

Then we went to Lexington, VA and Fonda, NY. I believe it was 1998 when I made a suggestion to then Mason Dixon President Dick Teachout about making the Lexington show 3 days instead of 2. He asked me if I would like to chair the show the next year and I've been chairing it ever since. In 1999, we traveled from Maine to Florida showing Total Eclipse Centellas. In December 2001, we were very fortunate to be able to purchase our gelding Tomaria's Caruso. He had won at least 4 first place ribbons that year at Nationals and we were very excited to show him the next year. By that time, Gary had taught me to drive the truck and trailer so he could retire from showing. Over his 3 year National show career, Gary won two first place ribbons and a reserve in the driving

their first paso finos including Maryan and George Schlesman who traveled with us in our early years of showing. We boarded horses for many years and had quite an active group of riders when Diane Dutt and Karen Basehore were boarding. We rode in many parades and showed off our horses at our farm's "Buffalo Bonanzas". It's hard to believe that almost 20 years have passed since I took that first fateful ride. It helped shape the course of my life and gave me some very good friends.

Zorro and Torbellino were the only two Paso Finos to participate in the April 6, 2012 CMO at 3 Bays Farm in Reading, PA. John and Susan have been riding their Paso Finos in Competitive Mounted Orienteering for 18 years. They have been Ride Managers for 20 rides, so far.

A CMO can have 5 to 10 Objectives to be found "in the woods". A map is given to the riders. All Objectives are marked on the map. On the back of the page, there are 3 Clues per Objective to help the riders find the Objectives. Each Objective is a 10 inch white paper plate with a word printed on it. Riders find the plate and write down the word, leaving the plate in place on the course. The Clues include a landmark with a compass reading. Find the landmark, read your compass and find the Objective. Sound Easy? Well, if not easy, then FUN!

The winner is the team that comes in with the MOST Objectives found in the SHORTEST time. Finding the Objectives

is more important than being fast, though. We have ridden 30 year old horses and finished 1st or 2nd! By the same token, on Saturday, we rode teenaged horses and came in 5th. Depends on how well you navigate and the terrain you are used to.

Paso Finos and Trail Riding with a Walk-Trot Group

Fourteen years ago I acquired a Paso Fino from B.J. Schuler. It was love at first sight, and in no time at all I had two Paso Finos. But to my dismay, I discovered that all of my friends from the trail riding club had non-gaited breeds. They were reluctant to trail ride with me, but I wanted to trail ride with them for the fellowship, so I decided to give it a try and go on a ride with them.

Many of my trail riding club friends said that I would have to ride with gaited horses because they didn't want to have to trot or canter the whole ride. Most of my trail riding friends were mature citizens, so I understood their desire to enjoy a peaceful, slow paced ride.

Carol Wood's horse was injured and lame, so I leased her my Paso Fino, Fury. She fell in love with him and we said, "Let's see if we can still ride together with the other club members." Most of those club members doubted that it could be done. Carol tried first. She took Fury on a ride in the mountains and because Fury moved slowly it seemed to work. The next ride I joined her with my Darty (D'Artagnan Bravo) who always wanted to be out front covering ground much quicker than the others. Now I understood why all the other breed owners felt that it was a harder ride for them. I could also see that I needed to do some adjusting with Darty.

Darty needed to slow down his walk and begin to enjoy his time with other horses as well as with me. I made him go behind the group, and when he began to walk and then gait, I turned him in a circle every few steps. He did not like it, so I put Fury in front of him. Then Darty walked slower and he started to calm down and stayed with the group.

At first I could not really socialize much, but each new ride got progressively better and I could place Darty anywhere in the group and he was fine. As a result of my persistence, my group enjoys having us ride together now and many of them have purchased Pasos or other gaited breeds.

I am currently working with Sonia (Sonia de Promesa), my show mare, and she sometimes will not slow down. However, using the same method of placing her in different positions within the group has really helped. Circling and flexing her in a calm way is what it is all about.—*Maryan Schlesman*

USEF MEMBERSHIP STATEMENT

Life, senior active and junior active members shall be eligible to participate in all classes at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions at the Preliminary Level or above and Combined Driving Competitions at the Advanced Level, Dressage, Reining and Vaulting Competitions and Endurance Rides. A nonmember may participate as a handler, rider, driver, owner, lessee, agent, coach or trainer at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions, Dressage Competitions, Reining Competitions and Combined Driving Competitions upon payment of a \$30 nonmember registration fee. Participants in the following classes are exempted from the Requirements of this rule: 1) leadline; 2) exhibitions; 3) games and races; 4) classes for 4-H members; 5) walk trot and academy classes (academy classes are classes limited to horses used regularly in a lesson program); 6) USDF introductory level tests, pas de deux and quadrille classes; 7) NRHA Endorsed Reining Competitions. 8) Opportunity classes, 9) citizens of other nations who have proof, in English, of current membership in good standing of their own National Federation, 10) USEA beginner novice division; and 11) assistant handlers in Dressage Sport Horse Breeding classes.

Motorized Vehicle Statement

In accordance with GR1301.7:

Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind, including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles, on the competition grounds of licensed competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. The parent(s), legal guardian(s), or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating a motorized vehicle in violation of this rule are solely responsible for any damages, claims losses or actions resulting from that operations. Violations of this rule will be cause for sanctions against the parent(s), guardian(s) and/or trainer(s) who are responsible for the child committing the offense. Penalties may include exclusion of the child, parent(s), guardian(s), and/or trainer(s) from the competition grounds for the remainder of the competition and charges being filed against any of the above individuals in accordance with Chapter 6.

Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

OPPORTUNITY CLASS RULES

- 1. Rider cannot have shown previously in any pointed PFHA class.
- Rider does not have to be a member of PFHA or USEF to show in the Opportunity Classes.
- 3. The horse must be a PFHA registered Paso Fino and the Rider does not have to own the horse.
- Classes will be judged in accordance with the official PFHA Rule Book for each division with the exception of the riding attire as stated in Number 5.
- 5. Riders are not required to ride in the official PFHA Costume for the division in which they are showing. They are required to wear appropriate casual riding attire. This includes slacks or dark jeans (no shorts), chaps, a casual shirt with sleeves such as a polo shirt or dress shirt. Proper riding boots are required. For participants twelve years of age and under, a riding helmet will be required.
- 6. If the Horse is only being ridden in the Opportunity Classes then the USEF Drugs/Medications Fee of \$16.00 does not apply to this horse.
- The Opportunity Class Fee will be a flat fee of \$10 per class.

AMATEUR TO RIDE CLASS RULES

- Rider must be a current member of PFHA with an amateur card.
- 2. Rider may have previously shown in PFHA pointed classes and may have won a placement.
- 3. The horse must be a PFHA registered Paso Fino and the Rider does not have to own the horse.
- Class will be judged in accordance with the official PFHA Rule Book for each division.
- Rider's attire and tack are to be in accordance with the official PFHA Rule Book for each division.
- If the horse is only being ridden in the Amateur to Ride Class then the USEF Drugs/Medications Fee of \$16 does not apply to this horse.
- 7. The Amateur Class fee will be \$20 per judge.


